



- Rage in price from \$2,000-\$40,000.



The Designer

- Must decide what types of garments should be included in the collection.
- Usually have a 3 month period to design
- Press and buyers get their first look at collection at the runway show.

The Plan

Designer work a year in advance

-In the spring the studio works for the following spring/summer season.

Research

-Each collection is researched so that all the items in it are **cohesive**, will be in style, and reflect the designers reputation.


Predicting Trends

- A designers most difficult take is forecasting what will e in style for the coming years.
- To do this:
 - -They know the past trends and look at repeats.
 - -They also purchase HIGH priced trend magazines.
 - -They observe what succeeded with consumers in the past.

The Design

- Designers work differently to put the design together.
- Steps
 - -Sketch, drape fabric on a dress stand, use patterns from previous seasons.
 - -Create a paper pattern
 - -Make muslin sample to try on mannequin or live model.
 - -Make an accurate pattern
 - -A sample is then produced in various colors
 - -Fashion show reveal

- Intro (beginning of the curve)
- Rise (style gains momentum, Movie Stars)
- Culmination (highest amount of acceptance)
- Decline (interest begins downward move)
- Obsolescence (end of the fashion)


